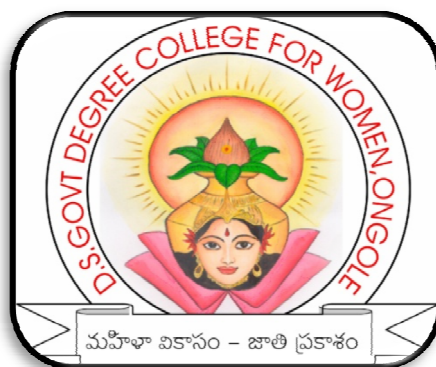

1. PARETO ANALYSIS-(80/20 ANALYSIS)

Pareto analysis is a statistical technique in decision making that is used for selection of a limited number of tasks that produce significant overall effect. It uses the Pareto principle – the idea that by doing 20% of work, 80% of the advantage of doing the entire job can be generated. Or in terms of quality improvement, a large majority of problems (80%) are produced by a few key causes (20%).

Pareto analysis is a formal technique useful where many possible courses of action are competing for attention. In essence, the problem-solver estimates the benefit delivered by each action, then selects a number of the most effective actions that deliver a total benefit reasonably close to the maximal possible one.

Pareto analysis is a creative way of looking at causes of problems because it helps stimulate thinking and organize thoughts. However, it can be limited by its exclusion of possibly important problems which may be small initially, but which grow with time. It should be combined with other analytical tools such as failure mode and effects analysis and fault tree analysis for example

This technique helps to identify the top portion of causes that need to be addressed to resolve the majority of problems. Once the predominant causes are identified, then tools like the Ishikawa diagram or Fish-bone Analysis can be used to identify the root causes of the problems. While it neither is common to refer to Pareto as "20/80", under the assumption that, in all situations, 20% of causes determine 80% of problems, this ratio is merely a convenient rule of thumb and is not nor should it be considered immutable law of nature.

The application of the Pareto analysis in risk management allows management to focus on those risks that have the most impact on the project

Background:

- Pareto Analysis is named after the 19th Century Italian Economist, Vilfredo Pareto, who noticed that approximately 80% of the wealth of the country was owned by 20% of the people? He also noted that this pattern repeated itself: of the 20% rich people, 80% of the wealth that they held was owned by 20% of these people.
- In the 20th Century, Joseph Juran noticed that this rule can be applied to business situations to help focus action on 'the vital few' items.
- This underlying principle is also known as 'The 80/20 Rule'.

Uses:

- The most common use of the tool is during problem analysis to find those sub-problems which, when addressed, will return the greatest benefits.
- Pareto Analysis can also be used in any general situation where you want to *prioritise action*. For example, you could use it when selecting potential solutions, by comparing their cost-benefit ratios.
- You can also use it in a team situation to show results of voting.

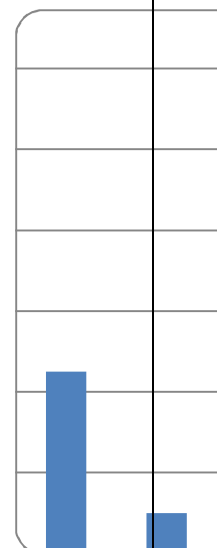
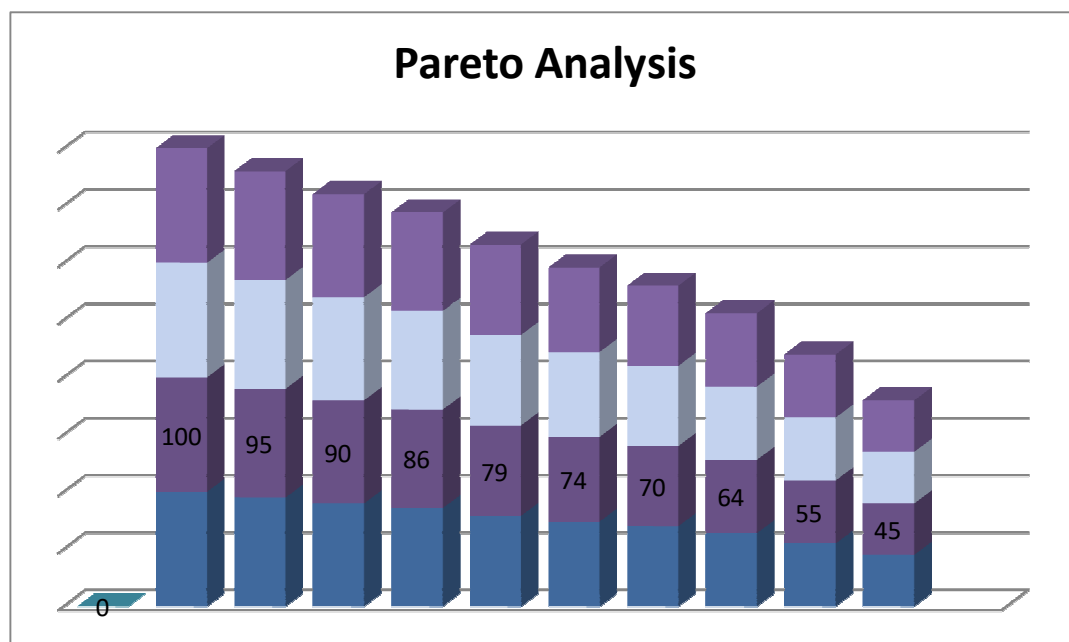

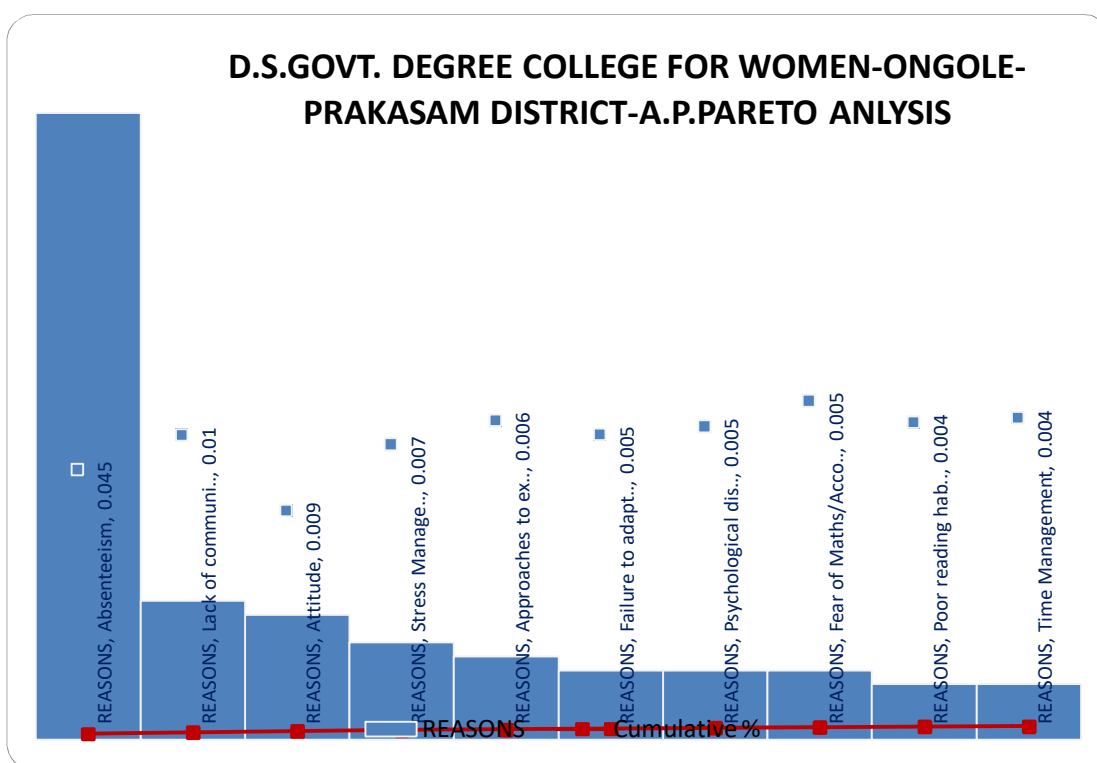
Cumulative Frequency Chart-2
